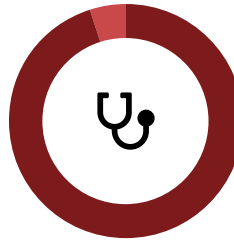

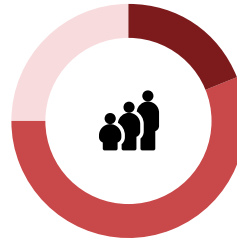

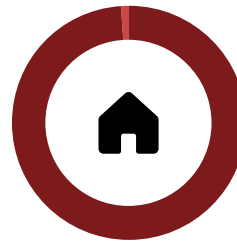
DIAGNOSIS

■ Spinal Cord Dysfunction: 5%



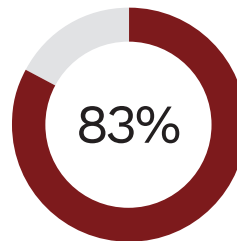
AGE
